- Access to more people and more types of people. Helps introduce you to people who you may otherwise not meet outside of your social circle.

- Breaking free from traditional gender roles.
   Due to the anonymity of online dating sites it allows anyone take charge and start the conversation. As well as empowering people to move away from the passive role.
- Beneficial for people who may be shy and closed off. The online world allows people to get comfortable with the person they are talking to before being launched into a social setting with them that would normally provoke feelings of anxiety or stress.
- Numerous methods of communication available. Through online dating platforms you can direct message, talk using audio or go face to face with video chat features.

### **ONLINE DATING PLATFORMS**




As technology has evolved in the last decade thousands of dating websites began to pop up online followed by the creation of numerous popular dating apps. With so many choices finding which one fits your needs and what you're looking for is part of the process. Another essential step is to understand which selection makes you feel safer and more comfortable.

**APPS** WEBSITES



Tinder is a geosocial networking and online dating application that allows users to anonymously swipe to like or dislike other profiles based on their photos, a small bio, and common interests. Once two users have "matched," they can exchange messages. Tinder is known for it's "hook-up" culture.







Bumble is a location-based social application that facilitates communication between interested users. Bumble is open to any sexuality but is primarily for heterosexuals' relationships. In heterosexual matches, only female users can make the first contact with matched male users, while in same-sex matches either person can send a message first.

eHarmony is a dating site that aims to help its users find a serious match that is best for them. Using compatibility matching system, the dating site can narrow **EHARMONY** down each person's match to a fewer list of possible matches. The site aims to find love and longlasting relationships for it's members worldwide.





**AGES** 18-24

Grindr is the largest geosocial networking and online dating application geared towards gay, bi and trans men. When you've created an account, you can add one photo and a small bio about yourself though this is typically saved for sexual preferences rather than information on your hobbies or your interests. Grindr is often used for "hook-ups" rather than dating.

Christian Mingle is an online dating service that suited to Christian singles seeking fulfilling relationships rooted in faith. This dating site now accepts people of any sexuality or gender identity. Although most members are heterosexual. Once each profile is created Christian Mingle approves each one to guarantee safety and authenticity for it's users.



APPS WEBSITES



Hoop is the latest app designed to target the younger generation and help them "score" in dating department. With no age selection function users are exposed to people of all ages. Known as the app to trade nude pictures on. This app includes the signature dating swipe left or right. However, swiping right connects individuals through Snapchat providing your username to the stranger you've matched with. Depending on the settings set on your Snapchat this also gives matches access to your location.



Based off the expression there are other fish in the sea, Plenty of Fish is a dating app and website created to give user's the opportunity to match and communicate for free. It is designed more like a dating site with the ability to search for specific people you may know using the platform. Plenty of Fish is the dating app for singles who don't want to break their wallets to make a connection.



Hinge is the dating app "designed to be deleted." Unlike a variety of it's competitors, Hinge is geared towards finding a relationship hence being known as the dating app for people who want to get of dating apps. This platform allows free users to only like up to ten profiles a day and gives the ability to pre-screen your matches for whatever preferences you have in mind.

OkCupid is an American-based, internationally operating online dating, friendship, and social networking website that features multiple-choice questions in order to **OKCUPID** match members. It is supported by advertisements, by paying users who do not see ads, and by selling user data for data mining.

# TIPS FOR CONNECTING ONLINE



When making a meaningful connection with someone it is important to put your best foot forward and remain on brand. However, connecting with others online can be scary so to keep yourself and your information protected there are a few precautions you can take to ensure your safety.

- Use different photos on your dating profile. If you use photos that appear elsewhere on the web such as various social media accounts it can be easy for users to reverse image search your photos. This is a gives direct access to your personal information. By using original photos on your dating profile you prevent others from being able to research you.
- Take steps to make safe usernames. It is time to move away from usernames being your first and last name. This gives anyone access to your biggest identifier, your name. Usernames should also be different for each account you create online to prevent people from locating you on multiple platforms.
- **Keep an eye out for fake or suspicious profiles.** Typically the less information shown on a dating profile the less likely someone is to be real. Beware of users who only have one photo or any photos that appear to be fake. Stay cautious of users who don't take the time to add information to their bios. The more you know about someone the better.
- Don't be afraid to block and report. Tools such as blocking and reporting are put in place to protect you and other users online. You don't have to match with users for these functions to take effect. If someone's profile seems suspicious or someone acts inappropriately towards you trust your instincts and put a barrier between the two of you.
- Wait to share personal information. Your personal information should be treated like a
  house key. It should not be given out to strangers. Information including full names,
  birthday, phone numbers and usernames for social media sites should only be given out
  to people you know are authentic and are comfortable with. Information such as credit
  card numbers, bank account numbers, passwords, addresses and social security
  numbers should never be given out to anyone.
- Stay away from financial offers. Never respond to a request about giving or receiving money from anyone online. These offers are a scam with the intention of stealing from you. Often these offers won't occur right away but will occur when an individual forms a trust or bond with you. If you are sent a request report and block the individual immediately.
- Look into the person you are talking to on social media. This step can help assure you that the person you are talking to is real. It can also give you information about who this person is and if their lifestyle matches your own. Keep in mind if you can find them they can find you. Be sure to adjust your privacy settings to only share details you are comfortable with.

## TIPS FOR MEETING IN PERSON



With the sigma of online dating being a thing of the past stranger danger has gone out the door with it. Meeting up with someone from online in real life can go wonderfully or it can go terribly wrong. The unknown can be scary so keep in mind some tips for staying as safe as possible when moving your online relationship to face to face.

- Video chat before in person contact is made. This is the best way to verify the identity of the person you are intending to meet up with. It can also get you comfortable with transitioning from talking online to speaking in person. If the person refuses to do a video call that can be seen as a warning sign that they may not be who they claim to be. Excuses such as "My video camera doesn't work," or "I don't have a video chat feature," are often not true.
- Share where you are going and who you are meeting with a friend. Screenshot your dates profile and grant your friend access to your location can help protect you in the long run. Check in with your friend throughout the evening, if they don't hear from you create a back up plan on what should be done next to ensure your safety.
- Meet in a public place. Avoid meeting up with people in unfamiliar environments such as a home, apartment or workplace. Isolated locations like parks and other secluded places should also should be held off until after the first date. Choose a spot that has lots of people around, this could include a restaurant, bar or coffee shop. Selecting a place within your own turf can help you feel more comfortable and know your way around.
- Use your own transportation. Don't rely on your date to transport you to and from. This will prevent your date from learning your address as well as allows you to remain in control of when you can leave. Even if the person offers to give you a ride don't get into a vehicle with someone you don't know and trust.
- Seek help of a staff member if need be. If at any point you need to leave the situation you can use certain code words to alert others you may be in an uncomfortable situation. For example, ordering an angel shot at a bar, telling a bartender you want to speak to Angela or writing a note on for staff on a napkin or check shows people around you that you need help.
- Drink with caution. Having a couple of drinks or a smoke on a date is completely alright.
  However, know your limit and do not feel pressured to check if your date is. Alcohol and
  drugs can alter your reality and make it easier for people to take advantage of you.
  Whatever you put into your body make sure you are the only one who has come in
  contact with it to avoid common date rape drugs that will hinder your ability to consent or
  think for yourself.

I will contact someone while on the date if I feel I am in an uncomfortable or possibly dangerous situation that I need to get out of.
I will attempt to video chat the person I intend to meet before I meet them to verify their identity.
I will watch my drink carefully to prevent myself from consuming something that could harm me.
I will not depend on dating platforms for my happiness.
