About the App

Bumble is a location-based social application that facilitates communication between interested users. It can be used for business connections, friendships and most commonly for dating. Bumble is open to any sexuality but is primarily for heterosexuals' relationships. In heterosexual matches, only female users can make the first contact with matched male users, while in same-sex matches either person can send a message first.

How do I talk to my child/student?
