Discord was initially geared toward video game players, providing them with ways to find each other, coordinate play, and talk while playing. However, now Discord has branched off to include various subcultures and is now known for being a VoIP and instant messaging social platform. Users have the ability to communicate with voice calls, video calls, text messages, media and files in private chats or on communities known as servers.
